Prayer

The meeting started with the opening prayer by Dr. Mano Stella Charling D, Assistant Professor of Education.

Leave of Absence

All the staff members were present.

Minutes

The minutes of the 5th IQAC (In-House) meeting for the year 2022-2023 was held on 09.01.2023 at 11.30 a.m. were read by the IQAC Coordinator.

Action plan of various committees

The action plans of the various committees were presented by the committee convenors.

Feedback analysis Committee

The convenor Mrs. Parimala Paul presented the report of the committee meeting held on 04.08.2023.

Programme Evaluation

Programme evaluation was consolidated and presented in the meeting. (*Annexure-1*)

Semester I, II & IV

Feedback was obtained on course content, teaching and areas in which teachers need improvement. Feedback given by the students were consolidated and discussed in the feedback analysis committee. The suggestions given by the students were given to the respective teachers for further action. (*Annexure-2 & 3*)

Semester III

Feedback was obtained on internship, practice teaching schools, mentors, teacher educator in charge and the activities carried out in the various courses. Feedback given by the students were consolidated and discussed in the feedback analysis committee. The suggestions given by the students were given to the respective teachers for further action. (*Annexure-4*)

Other Courses

Immediately after the completion of the special courses, feedback was received from the students on the course content, resource person involved, delivery of content, time management and learning outcomes achieved. Feedback given by the students were consolidated and discussed in the feedback analysis committee. Decisions regarding changes to be made in the course were taken up. (*Annexure-1*)

Teachers' Self-Appraisal

The self-appraisal forms given by the teachers were consolidated and discussed in the feedback analysis committee. (*Annexure-5*)

Faculty Peer feedback

Eight faculty members obtained peer feedback on their classroom teaching. (*Annexure-6*)

Faculty Appraisal by the Principal

Principal identified the weak areas of the teachers and discussed it with the individual faculty members.

Action Plan

Internship

- Lesson plans will be checked periodically.
- TLM will be checked.
- TAB sheets will be collected every Saturday.
- Submission of files will be monitored.
- Faculty should submit marks of practicum components as per the schedule.

Teaching

- Faculty should start the class on time and finish on time.
- Faculty Should not miss any class
- Core paper faculty – if on leave should exchange the class with other teachers.
- Optional teachers should make arrangements to monitor the work given.
- Faculty should prepare well for the class and should use digital tools.
- Stand while teaching
- Faculty should use various student centered methods

Assessment

- Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation is followed
- Correction of CCE papers should be done within a week and submitted to the Principal with mark register.
- Assignments / Activities should be corrected before CCE.
- Feedback should be given in the test and assignment papers.

Planning

- Faculty should have semester plans and annual plan.
- All activities should be planned well ahead of time.
- Whenever a deadline is fixed, faculty should stick to it.

Students Orientation

- Activities to be completed should be informed well ahead of time
- The purpose of doing various curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, the competencies to be developed and the attributes to be learnt are to be explained to students.
- Students should be trained to start all the work well in advance so that they will finish activities without any pressure. Avoid retaining students after 6.00 p.m.

Anti-Ragging Committee

- Ragging is banned inside and outside the institution.
- A ragging free campus should be maintained.
- The campus should be student friendly.
- Ragging is a crime.
- Juniors should not be ragged by seniors, and Vice Versa
- No one should dominate others.
- Ragging leads to depression, affects students and leads to inferiority complex
- Everyone should be treated equally.
- Ragging in any place in any form should be reported to the committee immediately.

- One to one talk session with the juniors on any one of the Saturdays should be arranged.

Counseling Cell

- Special talks will be organised to make the students aware of the importance of counseling and its benefits.
- Career guidance will be organised for II year students.

Digital Learning Support Cell

Digital Learning Support Cell has planned to organize one FDP on ICT for faculty members and two sessions for students.

Disciplinary Committee

The following instructions regarding general code of conduct in the schools during internship was given:

- Students should follow the rules and regulations of their respective Schools.
- Should maintain discipline and punctuality.
- Should wear sarees modestly and put up their hair neatly.
- Proper relationships should be maintained with students.
- All lesson plans and teaching aids should be signed by their respective staff.
- Students should inform the school and college office if taken leave.
- If school has declared a holiday for some purpose, students should come to college.
- All records should be completed on time.
- Students should avoid using cell phones during school hours. If found using cell phones they will be taken back and will not be given through the year.

Eco Club

- The staff in charge would take care of different parts of the campus to clean and maintain that area with the help of Eco Club students and gardeners.
- Green Consumer Day on 28th September 2023 and Earth Day on 22nd April 2024 will be celebrated.
- Seed Ball Project will be organised.
- Competitions on Green Consumer Day and Earth Day will be conducted.
- Environmental Awareness programmes will be conducted by students in practicing schools.

Examination Committee

- Self-Study Courses to be approved by the Academic Council will be implemented in this academic year 2023-2024.
- Records submission schedule during internship has been organized systematically and shared with students and faculty.

- Question bank validation will be done during this semester.

Grievance Redressal Committee

- Grievance Redressal committee decided to stick the mail id of the committee in the student notice board as well as on the grievance boxes.
- Half a day will be allotted in the first semester for the staff and students, should meet their advisors personally.
- For general papers and special subjects one period is assigned once in 15 days for library reference.
- The staff incharge planned to give orientation to the first year students about the grievance redressal mechanism.

Internal Complaints Committee

- General discussions related to their freedom will be done.
- Advice was given to the students on how to deal with the adolescent students during practice teaching.
- Action plan for the academic year 2023-2024
 - (i) Guest Lecture on “Work Life Balance” for the time management
 - (ii) Guest Lecture on “ Women Health Issues related to PCOD problem”.

Library Advisory Committee

To increase the usage statistics, it was planned by the Library Advisory Committee to do the following:

- **Staff Self-Appraisal Credit:** Points will be given to staff members based on their engagement with the library, specifically for book circulation and E-Resource access.
- **Additional Library Period for Students:** Apart from the regular library periods in the timetable, one extra period once in two weeks will be allotted for all subjects. The choice of utilizing this period in students' self-directed learning will be left to the staff, meaning they can decide which subject's students will benefit from the additional library time.

By implementing these strategies, the library can expect to see increased usage from both staff and students.

Placement Cell

- Resume preparation will be taught.
- New schools for campus recruitment will be identified.
- Senior faculty or alumni will be invited to address the students regarding work experience and culture.
- Other avenues for teachers should be identified.

Planning Committee

- Planning committee decided the number of working days, holidays, events of the college and days for three levels of teaching of internship.
- The due dates for the submission of various records for students and submission of marks for teachers was also planned.
- The annual plan was discussed with the student council and their suggestions were accepted.
- *Semester Plan:* Workload of the faculty was planned. Teaching hours for the courses were planned based on the credits. Semester wise time tables were prepared including curricular and co-curricular activities.

Research Committee

For Staff Study Circle

- Staff members should select three topics each out of the given forty-four topics and they should prepare the materials or the content.
- The material should include the following
 - Learning outcomes.
 - Matter in the form of Introduction, Content and Conclusion.
 - A minimum of five references inclusive of books and e-resources.
 - Activity for assessment.
- There should be one module for each topic.
- Each module should have material and a video of minimum 15 minutes duration.
- The content / material should be submitted on or before 16.08.2023 to the concerned staff for validation.
- First level Internal Validation will be done by Dr. Mrs. Nithila Devakarunyam, Dr. C. Jesintha Mary and Dr. A. Jayasundari on or before 20.08.2023.
- Second level external validation will be done by experts from outside the Institution.
- Video recording and editing will be done by Miss Selvamary before 31.08.2023.
- Guidelines for e-content will be shared with faculty members.

Student Council

- Periodical meetings will be planned and the student leaders will be made aware of their roles and functions.
- Activities of the college will be coordinated with the help of student leaders .
- The student leaders will be actively involved in the planning of the academic calendar and special courses.

Sports Committee

- Physical Education classes should be conducted during teaching practice.
- Lesson plan correction will be carried out.

- Assessment sheet and file submission should be done by the students.
- Inter-house competitions for 2nd years and 1st years will be conducted.
- Display items for Project Sports will be finalised.

Website Committee

- **Scroll and Marquee Update:**

The committee decided to update the website's scroll after every event and to update the marquee before the event. This will help in providing real-time information to the users and enhance user engagement.

- **Online Course Tab:**

The committee agreed to create an "Online Course" tab on the website. This tab will showcase the courses offered, course-related videos, activities, and assignments to provide a comprehensive learning experience to the students.

- **Social Media Integration:**

The website will include official social media webpage links to increase its online presence and promote better interaction with the audience.

Feedback for the academic year

2022-2023

Autonomous Setup

Students said they have studied in autonomous institutions. They were appreciative of the autonomous pattern which enabled them to learn more certificate courses and be involved in extracurricular activities. The students found our college differed from others in some aspects like timing, dress code, strict rules and regulations and allocation of marks for attendance.

Examinations System

Students were appreciative of the examination pattern followed in our college. They were of the opinion that the internal assessment pattern followed, helped them to have regular study habits and score better marks. It helped them to prepare well for the examinations.

They requested study holidays before the examinations and leave in between exams to study better.

Internal Assessment

The students appreciated the internal assessment carried out in our college. The assignments and tests given helped them to prepare for the end semester examinations.

Students were satisfied with the ratio of internal: external, 40:60 ratios. The students were in favour of the objective type questions included in the internal and external examination.

Study Habits

Students stated that their personal study habits changed for the better after entering the autonomous system of our college.

Internship

Students were satisfied with the facilities provided during internship. They stated it provided them with necessary experience, exposure and moulded them as good

teachers. They were also of the opinion that internships helped them to cultivate good habits like punctuality and regularity.

Life in Hostel

The hostel students enjoyed their life in the hostel. They were appreciative of the food provided in the mess. They were also satisfied with the study time and discipline maintained in the hostel. They suggested bathrooms can be added.

Life as a Day scholar

The day scholars were happy with the college timings but some felt that they reached home late due to various practices after college hours.

Co-curricular and Extracurricular activities

Students appreciated the Co-curricular and Extracurricular activities carried out in our college.

Social Service

Students enjoyed the social service activities carried out in our college.

Physical Education

Students were appreciative of the physical education classes and the facilities available in the Indoor Stadium.

Camp

Students enjoyed the camp activities. They were of the opinion that it brought about an all-round development in them. They learnt many skills like social communication and collaboration. Some suggested that night stay may be incorporated to make it more effective.

Field Trip and Educational Tour

Students enjoyed the field trip organised in the first year and the educational tour organised in the second year. They gave some suggestions to make it a pleasurable experience.

First Aid classes

Students found first aid classes to be useful. It was an eye opener for them and helped them to imbibe skills which could be useful in emergency situations.

Family Life education

Students learnt work – home life balance. The sessions were useful to clarify their doubts.

Advisory Group sessions

Students found the advisory session to be beneficial as they were able to interact with their advisors regarding their personal problems and clarify their doubts.

Assembly programme and Quiz programme

Students felt assembly and quiz programmes were useful. They were able to gain knowledge and acquire leadership, organisational and managerial skills.

Fine arts

Fine arts classes were appreciated by all. It helped them to develop their artistic skills.

House party

House parties were enjoyed by all the students. It provided them with the opportunities to compete healthily among houses.

Other Activities

The students were appreciative of all the other activities carried out in our college. They were of the opinion that it built self-confidence, removed stage fear and shaped their personality to become good teachers.

General Impression

The students felt that they had a pleasant stay and wonderful experience in our college. They were happy with the infrastructure, discipline and opportunities provided to mould them into better teachers.

Students feedback for Educational Tour

Travel Arrangements

The students felt that the travel arrangements were good and comfortable. Some of the students suggested that the train tickets may be booked previously to avoid outsiders in between the students. Some students suggested that vans can be avoided and instead only buses could be arranged.

Accommodation

All were appreciative of the accommodation provided.

Site Seeing

The students appreciated the sightseeing arrangements. Some wanted the number of places to be increased. Many felt that the shopping was not organised properly.

Food

Students appreciated the food provided. Some suggested that non-vegetarian meals could be given. Many complained that proper drinking water facilities were not provided in the hotel rooms.





CORE COURSES - COURSE CONTENT



CORE COURSES - TEACHING



SPECIAL COURSES - COURSE CONTENT



SPECIAL COURSES - TEACHING



CORE COURSES - COURSE CONTENT**



SCHOOL WISE : LEVEL - I







SCHOOL WISE : LEVEL - III**







- Faculty are expected to maintain a professional relationship with students.

5. Changes based on Feedback

a. Scripture/Moral Instruction Teaching

- Teaching practice sessions will be held for Scripture/Moral Instruction after the CEC final exam in the Scripture/Moral Instruction classes. Hence the same will be removed from III semester internship. It was suggested that students should be divided into groups and the Scripture

and MI teaching practice will be held following the peer teaching procedure from the academic year 2024-2025.

b. Digital Technology in Pedagogy

- Video material cannot be used as a substitute for teaching but can be used as additional teaching material.
- It was suggested to conduct Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation for assessment in Digital Technology in Pedagogy Course. Three CCE tests will be followed from the academic year 2024-2025.

c. Self Study Courses

- Every month one hour could be allotted for Self-Study Courses in the Timetable for discussion with the mentors.
- Pattern of the final examination Question Paper could be changed to 60:40 instead of 40:60. Question pattern could be as following:
 - Maximum of 40 Marks - Duration of 2 Hours.
 - Any two of the three short answer questions of each 5 Marks.
 - Any two of the three essays answer questions of each 15 Marks.
- The Course completion certificate could be distributed to those who have obtained a pass percentage during the final examination.

d. Practicum Components

- It was decided by the optional faculty to add the Laboratory activities and to remove the following from the existing Practicum components
 - i. Website Analysis
 - ii. Textbook Analysis
 - iii. Review of Research Article
- It was suggested to make changes in the curriculum framework based on the feedback.

6. Any other Business

- All committees should conduct meetings with 2023-2024 batch members and present the same in the next IQAC meeting.
- Peerfeedback file should be countersigned by the Principal at the end of the academic year.

As decided, on 16th July, 2024 our External member Dr. Fowmina. C Advocate, Madras High Court, has been invited to deliver a lecture on Navigating digital communication and online behaviour and Establishing clear policies and reporting procedures. Further, she will be giving some tips to follow while using public transport.

11. Library Advisory Committee

Following the three Library Advisory Committee meetings conducted in the academic year 2023-24, several key actions were implemented based on the suggestions and decisions made:

- St. Christopher's College of Education held three Library Advisory Committee meetings in 2023-24 to enhance library services. On June 8, 2023, student representatives suggested extending library hours, increasing circulation days, and enhancing digital resources.
- During the August 4, 2023 meeting with faculty members, an action plan was developed, introducing staff self-appraisal credits and additional library periods.
- The final meeting on April 24, 2024, attended by B.Ed. I and II-year students, proposed extra circulation days, a printing facility for day scholars, more subject books in Tamil, and a diversified collection. These suggestions were reviewed for implementation.

5. CIRF

St. Christopher's College of Education conducted two significant programmes under the MoU with the Computational Intelligence Research Foundation (CIRF), Chennai, emphasizing the integration of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in education.

On February 13, 2024, the college hosted a Faculty Development Programme (FDP)

on AI, led by Dr. Doreen Robin, Founder and Director of CIRF. The FDP focused on integrating AI tools such as Curipod and OpExams, promoting student-centered learning, curiosity, and critical thinking. Participants included all the teaching faculty members. The hands-on training provided educators with strategies for personalized learning and a deeper understanding of modern educational enhancements, including unified classrooms, personalized feedback, and collaborative experiences.

In a separate seminar, first and second-year B.Ed. and M.Ed. students participated in an interactive session led by Dr. Doreen Robin. This seminar began with puzzles highlighting teaching essentials and introduced tools like Curipod for slide-based lesson generation and instant assessment, CHAT GPT for idea generation, BARD (Gemini by Google) for multitasking, Nearpod for assessments, Ed Puzzle for interactive videos, and Quizlet/Bamboozle for educational games and quizzes. The seminar concluded with an interactive quiz session, allowing students to apply their newfound knowledge.

These programmes highlighted the transformative potential of AI in education, empowering both educators and students with effective teaching and learning practices.

6. G.U Pope College of Education

International seminar was conducted on the topic "Thinking Beyond Language" on 29.9.2023. It was Jointly organised with The International Centre for the University of Madras. The seminar was organized for students and staff of the St.Christopher's College of Education and the colleges of education from Tuticorin district participated in the international seminar.

The lecture was on education (and/or languages education) between our two regions with colleagues from the Education Department and affiliates. The lecture emphasized the importance of considering cultural differences in communication.

They explored how gestures, body language, facial expressions, and tone of voice can convey meaning that transcends words. Understanding and interpreting these non-verbal cues were highlighted as essential skills for successful intercultural interactions.

to transcend language barriers and connect with people from different linguistic backgrounds. The lecture encouraged embracing technology as a means to facilitate cross-cultural communication and collaboration.

14. St.Stephen's English Medium School

Students Feedback 2023-2024
