Students Satisfactory Survey 2017-2018

The students' Satisfactory Survey for the year 2017-2018 was conducted at the end of the fourth semester. One hundred fifteen students from the final year participated in the survey. Report is as follows:

115 students of the batch 2016-2018 liked the autonomous set up of our College. The examination system and CCE were up to their expectations. The students had suggested that examinations may be conducted with holidays in between. They mentioned that the internal assessment helped them to work systematically, which enabled them to face the examinations confidently.

Students wanted the internal assessment to be continued. Some had suggested the ratio of the internals could be changed to 20:80 or 30:70 from 40:60. Their study habits had been changed as they learnt the portions regularly and continuously. 100% of the students liked their internship. They liked the hostel accommodation but they wanted water scarcity during summer to be addressed permanently.

Life as non-resident students was liked by many. They regretted the system of marking absence for late coming.

They all enjoyed co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. All of them had appreciated indoor sports and physical education classes. Camp activities had helped them to learn new things.

They liked field trips and graded first aid classes, family life education, advisory group discussions, as well. Assembly programme and quiz programme had helped them to bring out their talents, they had remarked.

Fine art classes had developed their painting skill and craft work.

House parties helped all the individuals showcase their talents on the whole. They liked the programme of study and the college.

Action Plan:

Students' late coming has come down after the practice of marking absence for the forenoon session for late comers.

The students' grievances of water scarcity during summer have been taken to the notice of experts and they gave suggestions to increase ground water level.
